

These young people have been an exceptional cohort and we, as a school, are very proud and appreciative of the way they have conducted themselves as senior students and a respectful, responsible ambassadors for Leeton High School. Japan 2019

Our excursion party of fifteen students and four teachers returned to Australia yesterday after an amazing fifteen day Cultural and Language Excursion to Japan. Students spent time in Tokyo, Kyoto and Osaka experiencing some unforgettable moments such as navigating the Tokyo railway system, the most complex system in the world, the Hiroshima Peace Museum, shrines such as the 1000 Red Gates, travelling on bullet trains, attending a Rugby World Cup match and spending a week with Japanese host families. The host family experience also included attending lessons at our sister school Tondabayashi Senior High School. A massive thank you to Miss Ling for her hard work in organising this overseas excursion and to our supervising teachers who also made this excursion possible – Mrs. Schmetzer, Miss Wynan, Mr. Tregea. Thank you also to parents and students for their support and interest in this extraordinary experience and of course the generous host families who looked after our travellers while in Japan. Judging by the photos it was certainly well worth it.

Positive Behaviour for Learning Term 4 Focus

Congratulation to Bree McKellar in Year 12 who was the PBL major prize-winner at our last assembly. Well done to all students who were eligible for the prize draw or who have earned 25 PBL tickets to achieve a Big Blue Merit Certificate by demonstrating being respectful, responsible, learners. This term, our PBL lessons will focus on Study skills and habits, Restorative Justice and Justice Circles, Student Voice and Team building as linked to our values of being respectful, responsible, learners.

Wellbeing and Learning Programs

This term, due to the success of our Links to Learning boys group and Compact Leap Program for our Years 9 and 10 girls, we will be extending this opportunity to our Years 7 and 8 girls. We will be running two groups on a Monday, focussing on building positive relationships, positive self-talk, goal setting and planning for a purposeful future. We have had a fantastic response from the girls who have self-nominated or been selected to commence the Term 4 Compact Legends group and first session feedback has been excellent. Rock and Water will also commence this term, led by Mr. McKenzie and Mr. Morschel on a Friday morning. This program is targeted toward our junior students and will explore the principles of the Rock and Water program which is to provide young people with a pathway to self-awareness, increased self-confidence and social functioning. We are excited for the commencement of this program to further support wellbeing and learning in our school. Our Hands on Learning shed is almost complete and ready to become the base for our two Hands on Learning (HoL) groups, which will commence in the next few weeks. Franz Maher, HoL School Support Manager, visited Leeton High School last Tuesday to talk to students across Years 7-9 about this successful program. Leeton High School is one of only four schools in New South Wales to become a Hands on Learning school. The program originated in Victoria twenty years ago and is steadily growing in strength and numbers. The program supports students to explore their talents and strengths outside the traditional classroom setting allowing for students to learn through different hands on projects around the school tailored to individual and group interests and also in our community. Mr. Stout and Mr. Hubatka will be working with our Hands on Learning students along with Mr. MacAuley and Mr. Fulgrabe. Students can self-refer to be a part of this program or be nominated by staff.
