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WEEK 8 TERM 1 Commencing Monday 18<sup>th</sup>March 2019

As we commence this week it is impossible not to reflect upon the tragic events that have befallen our friends in New Zealand. The tragedy in Christchurch cuts to the very core of the values so many of us uphold. Regardless of your beliefs, background our culture, human life is incredibly precious and the actions in Christchurch both upset and unite us all.

Following the events in Christchurch many people will experience strong emotional and/or physical reactions. People may feel the need to share their anger, sorrow and acknowledge loss, even if they are not directly impacted by the event. For most people, these reactions will subside over a few days or weeks. For some, the feelings and reactions may last longer.

Some students could be affected to varying degrees and in different

ways. How they are affected will depend on their emotional and social ties to the people involved in the event as well as their own resilience, emotional health and support networks. They will also be affected by the community's reaction and media reports. It is important that all people who feel affected can access support. We encourage any member of our community who requires support to contact the school so necessary assistance can be offered.

On a happier note, I would like to start this week by acknowledging the amazing achievements of our representative swimmers and basketballers last week. Whilst there are extended details in Talking Sport, it is appropriate to acknowledge that our school

has eight new Riverina Sporting Representatives (some multiple) after two incredible days of sport last week in in Albury at the Riverina PSSA Swimming Championships and the Riverina PSSA Basketball Championships. Congratulations to all students on a wonderful achievement. We look forward to hearing all about their adventures!

The new week is a very busy one at Parkview highlighted by our engagement tomorrow (Tuesday) with National Anti-Bullying Day and Harmony Day. All students from our school will engage in these events, primarily based around celebrating what's great about our multicultural community and also engaging in activities that promote desirable behaviours and identify behaviours that are not wanted in our community.

### Free Travelling Dentist Program

Parkview Public School will host the Dental Medical Mobile Services Group (DMMSG) in the school next week from March 26.

The DMMSG provides high quality, on site general dental care for children aged 2-17 years of age. Under the Child Dental Benefits Schedule, funded by the Australian Federal Government, services are provided to students at no cost for eligible families.

The program involves: -dental education about oral hygiene -a comprehensive oral examination -scale, polish and clean -topical application of touth mousse (decay prevention)

To be eligible for the Child Dental Benefit Schedule you must: -be aged between 2-17 years of age -must be enrolled in medicare -must receive Family Tax Benefit A

If your child is not eligible for the Child Dental Benefit Schedule they: -can participate in the dental education -can receive dental service at the discounted rate of \$69 -if requested a receipt of payment can be provided to claim on private health insurance.

## **Riverina PSSA Swimming Championships**

13 Parkview students represented LNPSSA at the Riverina PSSA Swimming Championships in Albury last Wednesday, 13<sup>th</sup> March. On a remarkable day of swimming, 8 Parkview students qualified to represent Riverina at the NSWPSSA Swimming Championships at Sydney Olympic Park Aquatic Centre on April 12.

Daniella Draper produced an outstanding come from behind swim to finish second in the 11 Years Girls Backstroke and qualify for the NSWPSSA Swimming Championships in an individual event for the third time. Earlier in the day Xavier Chilko narrowly missed Riverina selection being touched-out into 4<sup>th</sup> position in a brilliant personal best performance in the 9 Years Boys 50m Freestyle.

Arguably the highlight of the day were the performances of our relay teams. Our Junior Boys Relay Team consisting of Jack Miller, Cruze Dale, Eden Richardson and Xavier Chilko qualified eighth fastest for the championships and shaved almost 5 seconds off their qualifying time to finish a very commendable 6<sup>th</sup> in the Riverina.





Our Senior Boys Relay team produced possibly the shock of the day overcoming some talented relay teams and reducing their qualifying time by over ten seconds to finish the 2<sup>nd</sup> ranked team in the Riverina and qualify for the NSWPSSA Swimming Championships in April.

The team of Connor Holden, Tallis McMillan, Kian Henman and Kobe O'Callaghan set a cracking pace, one that most teams could not match and in thrilling conclusion held on to justly secure a place at Sydney Olympic Park in April.

Our Senior Girls Relay team certainly delivered the performance of the day, the team of Daniella Draper, Chelsea Blacker, Ruby Miller and Amelia Irvin lowering their qualifying

time by an incredible 17 seconds to shock the field and finish 2<sup>nd</sup> from Lane 7, qualifying for the NSWPSSA Swimming Championships. The team, which two years ago were denied a place at Sydney Olympic Park by a mere 0.5 seconds, were determined to avoid a repeat, producing a thrilling performance to qualify.





## **Riverina Basketball Championships**

8 Parkview students travelled to Albury last Thursday, 14<sup>th</sup> March to represent LNPSSA at the Riverina PSSA Basketball Championships held at the Lauren Jackson Basketball Stadium.

The LNPSSA Boys team proved to be unbeatable on the day, defeating Southern Highlands, Griffith and Wagga to finish the day as joint champions. All Parkview representatives produced some pleasing basketball, with Connor Holden creative as a guard and Luca Pitt a strong presence as a small forward.

Tallis McMillan and Kobe O'Callaghan were both also prominent and after some outstanding displays were both selected in the Riverina PSSA Boys



representative team to contest the NSW Championships being held at Maitland in May.



The LNPSSA Girls team also produced some pleasing performances throughout the day to win two of the four games they contested. Taylah Axtill accumulated a significant number points scored as a guard, while Sophie Taylor and Chelsea Blacker were both in the thick of the action throughout the day. Amelia Irvin also impressed in her role as a Centre, and after some impressive performances throughout the competition, was selected in the Riverina PSSA Girls Basketball Team to contest the NSWPSSA Championships being hosted in Albury in June.

Congratulations to all of our students who participated in this experience and thanks is extended to the large number of community members who made the trip to Albury to support our children.
