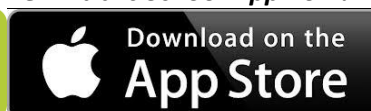

WEEK 5 TERM 2 Commencing Monday 27th May 2019

A huge Week 5 of the term is upon us at Parkview Public School. We begin this week with the exciting news that one of our students has been selected to represent NSW! **Tallis McMillan** was identified as being worthy of this honour after a series of outstanding performances for Riverina at the **NSWPSSA AFL Championships** in Sydney last week. We congratulate Tallis on this wonderful achievement! A full wrap of a busy sporting week can be found in Talking Sport later in the newsletter.

The new week, which is **Reconciliation Week** promises to be a busy one with a range of scholastic, sporting and cultural activities sure to appeal to all members of the community. Reconciliation Week is a significant week not only in our community but in broader Australia as we seek to celebrate a diverse and inclusive society and aim to educate and understand what has gone before us with a goal of shaping a more positive future for all Australians.

Reconciliation Week is celebrated from May 27-June 3 each year. These dates commemorate two significant historical milestones in the reconciliation journey — the successful 1967 referendum, and the High Court Mabo decision respectively.

National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

Reconciliation is important to all Australians as we move forward, creating a nation strengthened by respectful relationships between the wider Australian community, and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

National Reconciliation Week (NRW) started as the Week of Prayer for Reconciliation in 1993 (the International Year of the World's Indigenous People) and was supported by Australia's major faith communities. In 1996, the Council for Aboriginal Reconciliation launched Australia's first 'National Reconciliation Week'.

In 2000, Reconciliation Australia was established to continue to provide national leadership on reconciliation. In the same year, approximately 300,000 people walked across Sydney Harbour Bridge as part of NRW, showing support for the reconciliation process. Today NRW is celebrated by communities, businesses and individuals at thousands of events across Australia.

This year during National Reconciliation Week, Reconciliation Australia invites all Australians to learn more about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures and histories, to share that knowledge and help us grow as a nation.

This year's theme '**Grounded in the Truth; Walk together with Courage**' outlines the idea that to foster positive race relations, the relationship between Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and the broader community must be grounded in a foundation of **truth**. Whether you're engaging in challenging conversations or unlearning and relearning what you know, this journey requires all of us to walk together with **courage**.

At Parkview Public School our students will be immersed in their usual range of learning experiences linked to Reconciliation Week and will also engage in our annual Reconciliation Week Walk and Community Event on Thursday. We strongly encourage as many community members as possible to join us at the Leeton Post Office from 8am Friday and share our Reconciliation Week Walk followed by a community breakfast.

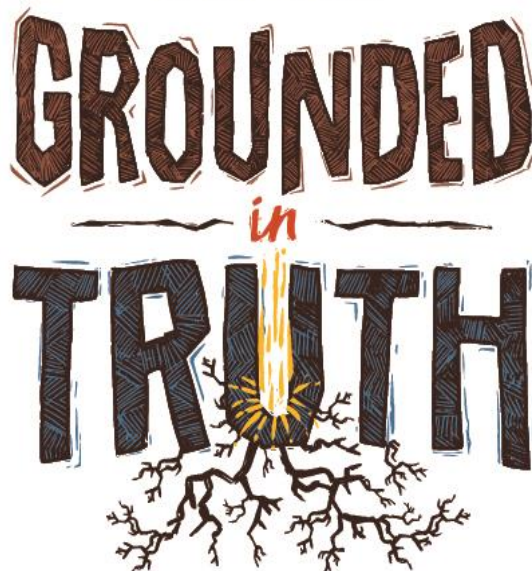

Reconciliation Week Events

The excitement, acknowledgement and celebration of Reconciliation Week arrives at Parkview next week! We have a huge number of events planned for Reconciliation Week in our school. Below is an outline of what we are doing:

Wednesday, 29th May

The school is hosting a Visiting Performance from acclaimed Indigenous Performer Dion Drummond. Dion will produce two performances for the school as follows:

10am-11am: Kindergarten-Year 2

11.35am-12.35pm: Years 3-6

There will be no cost for these performances as this opportunity will be a key part of our children's learning as a part of Reconciliation Week.

Dion is one of Australia's most experienced Indigenous performers, covering both Mainland and Islander culture as a dancer, singer and storyteller. During his visit, Dion will share tales and artefacts from his cultures, teaching students about the different traditions of both Torres Strait Island and Aboriginal storytelling, song and dance. Students will participate in learning a little of the language, including some songs, as well as a look at the skills of Indigenous dancers.

Thursday, 30th May

This day will be the centre piece of our Reconciliation Week celebrations at the school. We will host our traditional Reconciliation Week Walk and Community Breakfast followed by some unique opportunities as outlined below.

*Year 5 & 6 students will engage in an entertaining and educational session with Eddie Woo.

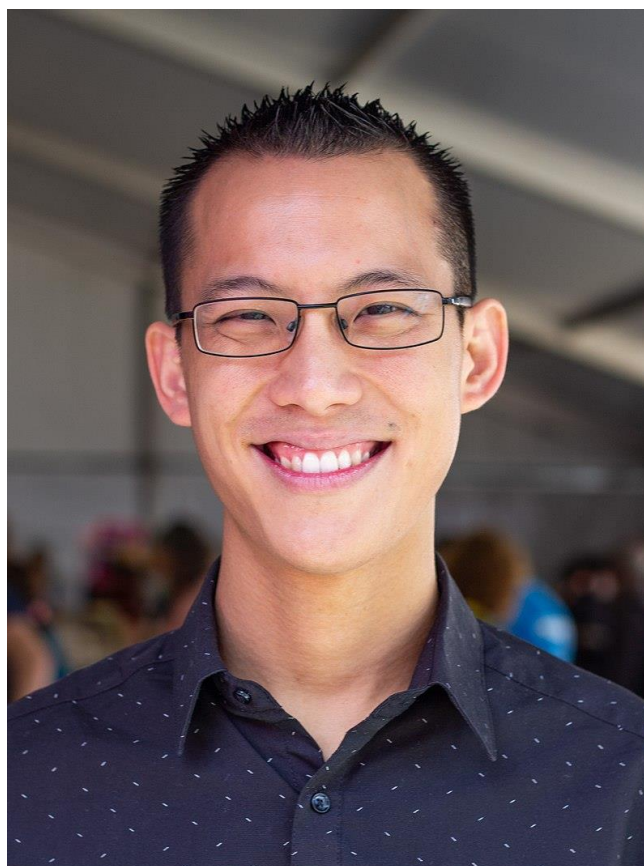
Who is Eddie Woo?

Eddie Woo is an Australian secondary school teacher at Cherrybrook Technology High School and is best known for his online mathematics lessons published on YouTube. Woo's parents migrated to Australia from Malaysia around 1970 for better education opportunities for their children. He studied at the James Ruse Agricultural High School in New South Wales and earned his Bachelor of Education (Honours) in Secondary Mathematics and Information Technology from the University of Sydney.

In 2018, Woo was famously awarded Australia's **Local Hero Award**.

His YouTube channel has over 500,000 subscribers and more than 30 million views worldwide. In 2018, Woo hosted a popular show called *Teenage Boss* on the ABC, which gave teens control of their family's financial decisions for a month.

Woo's book entitled *Woo's Wonderful World of Maths* was published on 25 September 2018. It addresses questions like "Why are rainbows curved?" and "Why aren't left-handers extinct?", with the answer being: maths, and that maths is all about patterns and the universe is extraordinarily patterned!



Year 6-7 Transition

Students will engage in a 6 week program at LHS to prepare them for the up-coming transition to secondary education. 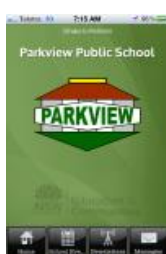

NSWPSSA Australian Football Championships

Tallis McMillan and Kobe O’Callaghan have returned from representing Riverina at the **NSWPSSA AFL Championships** at Olds Park in Penshurst (Sydney). Both boys were part of a Riverina Team that finished a creditable 5th at the event following 3 days of extremely strong competition against the best primary school footballers from across NSW.

Kobe played predominantly as a ruckman throughout the tournament and produced some impressive performances, frequently providing first use of the ball for midfielders at stoppages through deft ruck work.

Tallis played mainly as a midfielder throughout the week and was one of the Riverina’s most damaging players, racking up possessions and using the ball efficiently. He was rewarded for an excellent week of football by being selected in the NSWPSSA Australian Football team to contest the School Sport Australia National Championships in Mandurah (Western Australia) in Term 3. Tallis becomes the 4th Parkview student (and the third in 4 years) to be selected in the NSWPSSA Australian Football State Team which is a tremendous achievement.
