Premier's Debating Challenge

Parkview's two Premier's Debating Challenge teams have enjoyed a terrific day of learning and debating as part of the first two rounds of the Premier's Debating Challenge hosted at Leeton PS last Wednesday. Our two teams, the Parkview Cats (consisting of **Amelia Irvin, Ruby Miller, Daniella Draper and Ali Haider**) and the Parkview Giants (consisting of **Drew Browne, Benji Roden, Jye Mawer and Eden Richardson**) representented our school with distinction and are now very well prepared for the up coming challenges in the Premier's Debating Challenge.

The opening debate saw the Parkview Giants argue the negative for the topic 'That primary schools should spend one afternoon a week teaching internet skills' against Leeton PS. The debate was a tight affair against a well organised Leeton PS team with the Parkview team narrowly being defeated.

The second debate of the day was adjudged as the highest overall standard of the day with the Parkview Cats arguing the negative for the topic 'That teachers should have to participate in all school sport and exercise classes just like students'. Parkview won a high level debate in a very close decision against Leeton PS.

The final debate of the day saw the Parkview Giants come up against Darlington Point. Arguing the negative argument for the topic 'That we should ban kids under 18 from buying junk food like lollies, chips and ice creams.' The team produced some well constructed arguments but could not sway the adjudicator in their favour.

Term 2 with 4/5D

Science with 4/5D started with looking at adaptations of plants. Below are some pictures of the plant growth that has been occurring. We planted Poppies and Sunflowers and had different aims to our experiments.









The sunflower seeds grew so well that we thought in our front garden tyres we should plant some. So here's to remembering to water the sunflower seeds and having some bright flowers outside our room, keep an eye out on these.

We decided to add another path on the experimental journey.

<u>Aim:</u> How long will it take to grow different strains of rice ?





We used different strains of rice and learnt about how rice grows. We also set up the experiment like real scientists. We used filter paper and Petri dishes to set this experiment up.

We placed different rice strains into Petri dishes and labelled each container then watered and now just have to check the water amounts and wait to see what will happen next.



Some of our rice has now started to grow. We are now able to see the roots. We can't wait to see the final stages of this experiment.

OFFICE OF SPORT CLAIM TWO \$100 ACTIVE KIDS VOUCHERS
