This week we are excited to share some extremely exciting news regarding Year 6 student, **Eden Richardson**, and his entry in the 'Seven Steps for Writing Success National Narrative Writing **Competition'**. Eden's submission was one of 1900 entries nationwide! Incredibly, in what is a wonderful reflection on his high level writing prowess, he was one of just 88 students nationwide to receive acknowledgment for the quality of his entry, receiving a High Commendation for 'crafting powerful writing that engages the audience's emotions'.

Mistaken Identity

"Why?" I screamed as he slowly bled out in my arms.

You're probably wondering how I got here, let's rewind. Hi, I'm James, and I'm a twin. My brother Jamie and I were born in 1997, and I was appropriately given the nickname twin one, since I was born one minute earlier. Our parents died in a car crash when we were three, so we got shipped off to an orphanage in London until we were eighteen. During those long fifteen years we had to find a way to keep ourselves entertained, so we began a prank war.

The pranks started off harmless, with locking doors, spraying water, and tapping shoulders, but as our brains began to enlarge, so did our pranks.

I pulled off my first major prank when I was eight years old. I put a bucket of slime on my door, and called his name. When he opened up the door, the bucket fell on his head. When he lifted it off of his head you should have seen his face, it was priceless!

I always knew the day would come when a prank went wrong, and that's where we are now. A month before it all happened I was sitting in my room on my bed thinking of prank ideas to retaliate for what he did to me, when it came to me. What if I were to fake my death? He'd go nuts. So for many, many weeks, I planned nonstop, until the day finally came, August 18, National Couples Day.

I knew he would be out with Brittney, his girlfriend, all day, couple canoeing over Lake Serpentine. So I got set up in position at ten o'clock sharp, when I knew they would be getting out of the lake for some food - it was also the time I had arranged with my 'hitman' from Craigslist. I saw them pulling up to the bank, and I also saw my 'hitman' walking over. It was perfect, all these months of planning hadn't gone to waste. My brother spotted me and jogged over to me. He asked me what I was doing here, and I replied with something like just checking in on you. Then the 'hitman' screamed, "Everybody get on the ground!" I stayed standing, I knew it was fake. My brother stayed standing as well. He had always stood by me and he wasn't going to stop now. The 'hitman' screamed again, "Get on the ground!" I looked him dead in his eyes and said "no," just to really sell it. The 'hitman' lowered the gun to my chest, just as I told him in practise. Then he shot. He shot a real bullet. That wasn't meant to happen. My brother instinctively jumped in front of me, he had always said he'd take a bullet for me - I never believed him. The bullet hit him square in the stomach and he fell to the ground, the hitman ran away. I dropped to my knees, knowing he was a lost cause.

That's the story, in all its glory. That was ten years ago. Now I've got two children, and a wife. It's crazy. One minute you're mourning over your brother's death, the next you're in the hospital for your second kid. So just a bit of advice from someone who needed it ten years ago - never get caught in the moment. Eden Richardson-6G
