Presentation Day Event

The 2020 Parkview Public School Presentation Event will be held during the day on **Tuesday, 15th December**. Due to the NSW Department of Education's COVID-19 Protocols, we are unable to host parents at this event. In place of parental attendance, we will be livestreaming this event.

All students who are receiving an award will receive a letter this week confirming details of the livestream so parents can login should they choose. Our Presentation Event will also feature performances from our band and dance groups (junior, senior and combined).

Our event will be held in three sections to help us to comply with social distancing associated with the DoE's COVID-19 Protocols. The timeline for the event is as follows:
