

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

To conclude the semester, all students will tomorrow (Tuesday, 30th June) receive their **Semester 1 Reports**. While schools were provided with an extension until September to produce these documents, our staff have worked hard to produce these modified documents so we have a full semester of face-to-face teaching to provide parents and carers with feedback in Semester 2. As we look towards the final week of the term, I would like to thank all stakeholders in our community for their unwavering efforts throughout these unprecedented times. The flexibility, understanding and genuine effort shown by everyone to make the best of a difficult situation has been greatly appreciated. We are still awaiting confirmation of the events that we can definitively host next term, and as such additional communications particularly linked to dates and events are likely to be communicated via email and our social media streams in the coming weeks.

We have five huge days in the final week of the term, with much to consider as we work through those exciting days. Below is an outline of the major events that will shape the week:

School Roofing Project Timelines

The roofing project at the school commenced in ernest last Monday with the Canteen Block now all but completed. This means that normal operations in the Canteen Block including food services, Uniform Shop, Sports Shed and Toilets resumed usual functionality from today. Due to the rain experienced early last week the project was delayed somewhat, with the following timelines and plans scheduled:

Monday, 29th June-Wednesday, 1st July: Library

- *2M will be displaced from their classroom for the period of the Library upgrade, engaging in classes from the IT Lab until the end of Wednesday.

Bright Beginnings-Play based Learning for 4 & 5 Year Olds

Student Absences Protocols

The school successfully implemented SMS Absence Notifications to parents when children are absent last week. The new process means parents and carers receive a text message to the main mobile number provided to the school notifying you that your son and/or daughter has been marked absent from school.

When parents receive this message they are able to respond with a text outlining the reason for the absence. This will then be recorded in our database and will act as the official explanation for student absence on this day.

All response texts explaining absence should include:


- * student's full name
- * class
- * date of absence
- * explanation of absence

An example of a response to school generated absence notification could be:

"Jane Smith (3Q) is absent today (23.6.20) as she is ill with the flu."
"Johnny Citizen (KE) was absent on June 22 as he had a sore throat"

Please note that the school is unable to engage in text conversations via this medium. If you need to discuss your child's absence with your child's teacher, please still make a phone call to the school.

Below is how a school generated absence SMS will look when you receive it, and how it will look when you respond.



Nationally Consistent Collection of Data - School Students with Disability

Parkview Public School and all schools across Australia will be involved in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability. The NCCD (the national data collection) is an annual collection that counts the number of school students with a disability and the level of reasonable educational adjustment they are provided with. The national data collection will count students who have been identified as receiving an adjustment to address a disability under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (the DDA). The DDA can be accessed from the ComLaw website at www.comlaw.gov.gu.

All schools across Australia collect information about students with disability. The information provided through the national data collection will enable all Australian governments to better target support and resources to benefit students with disability. For the purposes of the national data collection, students who receive personalised learning interventions, as well as those with learning difficulties, speech, vision and hearing difficulties, as well as chronic health conditions like epilepsy, diabetes or asthma, that require active monitoring by the school, may be included. The definition of disability for the national data collection is based on the broad definition under the DDA. Staff are currently collating this data to enter on the register. An e-learning resource about the Disability Standards for Education 2005 is freely available for the use of individuals, families and communities at http://resource.dse.theeducationinstitute.edu.au/

How will my child's privacy be protected?

Protecting the privacy and confidentiality of all students and their families is essential. Personal details such as student names or other identifying information will not be provided to local or federal education authorities.
