PARKVIEW PUBLIC SCHOOL WEEK 9 TERM 2 Commencing Monday 22nd June 2020

Week 9 of the term will be a very big one for our community in many ways, the biggest of which is the long awaited commencement of the roofing project at the school. This project as previously communicated is anticipated to take 4-5 weeks and will include the restoration of roofing structures for all permanent buildings in the school with the exception of the Hall.

As a result of this project, there will be some internal changes in the school to ensure the project can proceed. Children will be informed of these changes daily so they are aware of any impacts that they may have to adjust to.

The new school week also sees the commencement of a new attendance communication strategy at the school aimed at helping to improve student attendance and also helping parents to communicate explanation for student absence. More information in relation to this strategy is included later in the newsletter.

Week 9 of the term is also notable for a number of learning initiatives being continued or initiated including the maintenance of our strong commitment to STEM-based learning in association with the SISP Program and the establishment of a like-schools network for the improvement of literacy and numeracy outcomes of our students. Further details linked to this will be shared in coming weeks.

With so much happening in our community, please examine the details of this week's newsletter as you plan your week:

Student Absences Protocols

The school will be implementing SMS Absence Notifications to parents when children are absent, commencing this Tuesday, 23rd June (tomorrow). This means that you will receive a text message to the main mobile number provided to the school notifying you that your son and/or daughter has been marked absent from school.

When parents receive this message they are able to respond with a text outlining the reason for the absence. This will then be recorded in our database and means parents will have another alternative to writing notes or responding via the school app to explain student absence.

All response texts explaining absence should include: *student's full name *class *date of absence *explanation of absence

An example of a response to school generated absence notification could be: *"Jane Smith (3Q) is absent today (23.6.20) as she is ill with the flu." (outlined below) "Johnny Citizen (KE) was absent on June 22 as he had a sore throat"*

Please note that the school is unable to engage in text conversations via this medium. If you need to discuss your child's absence with your child's teacher, please still make a phone call to the school.

Below is how a school generated absence SMS will look when you receive it, and how it will look when you respond.

Further relating to student absence, included in today's newsletter are the NSW Department of Education's official documents linked to student attendance. Please take the time to examine these as we aspire to further improve student attendance, and therefore the number of quality learning experiences they engage in at Parkview Public School.

Completing Absentee Notes and Notices

Information for parents and carers

It is important to tell the school if your child has to be absent from school and to provide a reason for the absence.

Principals are legally responsible for keeping accurate records of student attendance.

Principals are also responsible for deciding if the reason given for an absence is justified.

Wherever possible, parents and carers are encouraged to provide an explanation for absences before the absences occur.

The Principal of the school has the right to question parents' requests for their child to be absent from school. The Principal also has the right to question an explanation given for a child's absence from school.

To explain an absence parents and carers may:

- send a note, fax or email to the school
- telephone the school, or
- visit the school.

Bilingual Absentee Notes

Three bilingual absentee notes are available to assist you to inform the school of your child's absence. Absentee note 1 should be used when a child is absent for 1 whole day.

Absentee note 2 should be used when a child is absent for more than 1 day.

Absentee note 3 should be used when a child is absent for part of the day.

Absentee Notices

If the school has not received an explanation for a child's absence they may send you an Absentee Notice.

Principals use the Absentee Notice to contact parents within two days of an unexplained absence. The Absentee Notice must be completed in English and returned to the school within seven school days, giving a reason for the absence.

Completing details of absences

Sections of the Absentee Notes and the Absentee Notice ask you to provide details for your child's absence or partial absence.

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For the school to be able to understand the reasons given, these sections should be completed in English. Possible reasons are provided in this leaflet and have been translated into English for you to copy onto the forms, if applicable.

If you have difficulty understanding the Absentee Notes or Absentee Notice or with completing the details you may telephone the school to explain the reason for your child's absence. If you telephone the school you do not need to fill in a written note as well.

Telephone Interpreter Service

If you need an interpreter to assist you to contact your child's school, please call the Telephone Interpreter Service on 131 450 and ask for an interpreter in your language. The interpreter will call the school and stay on the line to assist you with your conversation. You will not be charged for this service.



Compulsory School Attendance

Information for parents

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards for homeschooling.

Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

The Importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time

- ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- gives students time to greet their friends before class
- reduces classroom disruption.

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

What are my legal responsibilities? What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include

- being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance e.g. attending a funeral.

Following an absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, if the school has not received an explanation from you within 2 days, the school may contact you to discuss the absence.

Principals may decline to accept an explanation that you have provided if they do not believe the absence is in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances your child's absence would be recorded as unjustified. When this happens the principal will discuss their decision with you and the reasons why.

Principals may request medical certificates or other documentation when frequent or long term absences are explained as being due to illness. Principals may also seek parental permission to speak with medical specialists to obtain information to collaboratively develop a health care plan to support your child. If the request is denied, the principal can record the absences as unjustified.

Travel

Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during school term is necessary, discuss this with your child's school principal. An Application for Extended Leave may need to be completed. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and therefore contribute to your child's total absences for the year.

In some circumstances students may be eligible to enrol in distance education for travel periods over 50 school days. This should be discussed with your child's school principal.

School Roofing Project Timelines

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data - School Students with Disability

Parkview Public School and all schools across Australia will be involved in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability. The NCCD (the national data collection) is an annual collection that counts the number of school students with a disability and the level of reasonable educational adjustment they are provided with. The national data collection will count students who have been identified as receiving an adjustment to address a disability under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (the DDA). The DDA can be accessed from the ComLaw website at www.comlaw.gov.au.

All schools across Australia collect information about students with disability. The information provided through the national data collection will enable all Australian governments to better target support and resources to benefit students with disability. For the purposes of the national data collection, students who receive personalised learning interventions, as well as those with learning difficulties, speech, vision and hearing difficulties, as well as chronic health conditions like epilepsy, diabetes or asthma, that require active monitoring by the school, may be included. The definition of disability for the national data collection is based on the broad definition under the DDA. Staff are currently collating this data to enter on the register. An e-learning resource about the Disability Standards for Education 2005 is freely available for the use of individuals, families and communities at http://resource.dse.theeducationinstitute.edu.au/

How will my child's privacy be protected?

Protecting the privacy and confidentiality of all students and their families is essential. Personal details such as student names or other identifying information will not be provided to local or federal education authorities.

Year 5 2021 Opportunity Class and Aurora College Placements 2021

Today commences the period of time where parents of Year 4 students can apply for consideration for inclusion in Opportunity Classes and Aurora College Placements for Year 5 in the 2021 School Year.

Opportunity classes can provide intellectual stimulation by grouping together high potential and gifted students who may otherwise be isolated from a suitable peer group.

New for 2021 entry

A Year 5 virtual opportunity class has been established at Aurora College for students in rural and remote NSW who will be attending schools on the following list in 2021:

Testing

Students who wish to be considered for opportunity class placement will sit the Opportunity Class Placement Test on **Wednesday 16 September 2020**.

How to apply

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 5 opportunity class entry in 2021, you need to apply between **Tuesday 9 June 2020** and **Friday 26 June 2020**. You will need to access the online application at <u>https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-5</u>. You must **not** use the child's email address.

If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the High Performing Students Team for assistance after **9 June 2020**. Contact details can be found on the web site shown below.

You must submit only ONE application for each student.

Important – the school cannot apply on your behalf.

Aurora College

The virtual school for rural and remote students

Aurora College is NSW's virtual school, offering a mix of online and residential school classes for high potential and gifted students in rural and remote government schools.

The school provides innovative, flexible learning in a whole new context, by allowing students to connect locally and to learn globally. Students connect with their teachers and classmates in timetabled lessons using cutting-edge technologies in a virtual learning environment.

Aurora currently offers selective classes in English, mathematics and science to Year 7-10 students and also gives Year 11 and 12 students the opportunity to study subjects not available in their own school.

In 2021, Aurora College will have an Opportunity Class for Year 5 students enrolled in rural and remote government primary schools. Students will study the content of the Mathematics and Science and Technology syllabuses, with a focus on STEM.
