COVID Safe Protocols.

Please remember the following key points to ensure we all do everything we can to keep our community COVID-19 Free:

* The border between NSW and Victoria closed as of 12:01am 8 July 2020. All staff and students returning from Victoria after this time must have a permit to enter NSW and are required to self-isolate for a period of 14 days.

With the exception of staff and students who reside in a border town, all other staff and students who have been in Victoria in the 14 days before the commencement of school should not attend school until they complete the 14 days self-isolation period since they left Victoria.

NSW Health has requested anyone who has been in Victoria and is unwell or has flu like symptoms arrange to be tested through their local medical practitioner or one of the COVID-19 clinics.

* We would like to remind parents and carers not to send students to school if they are unwell, even if they have mild symptoms. Schools will make appropriate arrangements to return students home if they become unwell at school. Students should be at school unless:

- they have a medical certificate which states that they are unable to return to school due to an ongoing medical condition and the expected time frame
- they are currently unwell.

* Please be aware that all visitors to the school during school hours will be required to sign a 'School Site Form' stating your name and phone number and/or email address. This form acts as a statement by you that you are aware of and will comply with the health advice of the day, including hygiene and social distancing requirements. This form will assist the school with contact traces if the need arises.

Welcome back to Term 3!

Welcome back to students, families and staff. This term will again be another busy one. With updated health advice and changes to state and national restrictions, schools are able to recommence the majority of school-based activities from the start of Term 3 (20th July 2020).

All students should be learning on-campus unless they are unwell or have a medical certificate to support their absence. To keep our community as safe as possible students and staff will observe recommended hygiene practices:

- regularly washing hands
- using hand sanitiser which is kept in every learning or common space
- avoiding sharing drinks or food
- coughing or sneezing into your elbow, or a tissue which should be discarded immediately
- filling water bottles from bubblers rather than using the bubbler directly

Physical distancing of children in schools is not required under the AHPPC guidelines. All adults must maintain physical distance from each other (1.5m) including teachers and support staff, and parents. Parents should ensure school pick up and drop off arrangements enable them to physically distance from one another and from staff.

Just a reminder that anyone returning from Victoria since 8 July must self-isolate for 14 days from the date of their return to NSW before returning to school.

Cooler Classrooms

The Cooler Classrooms Program is a \$500 million, five-year investment by the NSW Government to improve learning environments in public schools across NSW. This term will see the commencement of the installation of air conditioning and fresh air ventilation to approximately 27 classroom and library spaces at Leeton High School. It is estimated construction works may take up to 18 weeks. An installation plan has been developed to minimise disruption of construction works on school operations. The installation of these new air-conditioning systems will ensure a far more comfortable teaching and learning environment for students and staff and will certainly make for a more pleasant summer when completed.

Year 6 into 7 Transition Program

We are currently finalising our Transition Program in consultation with our primary schools and in keeping with current COVID restrictions. We are very excited to meet our newest students and our Transition Team, Ms. Tracey Byrne (Head Teacher Welfare) and Mr. Shane Crosbie (Year 7 Adviser 2021) and Mrs. Meagan Crelley (Principal) are available to answer any questions you may have in regards to your child joining us at Leeton High School. Year 10 into 11 2021 Subject Selection

Unfortunately, we are still unable to hold large events on-site including parents/carers. We will however, hold an information session for Year 10 students to inform them of the subject selection process into Year 11, HSC pathways and subject specific information delivered by relevant teaching staff to prepare them for the important decisions they will make in terms of the next two years of study. This session will be held Friday 14th August during the school day. We will make this information available to parents/carers.

Students were emailed (school email address) the Subject Selection and Senior Course Outlines booklet for Year 11 2021 information booklet at the end of last term and will receive a hard copy during their Career lessons. Please contact the school if you have any questions.

HSC Minimum Standards testing

Students need reading, writing and numeracy for everyday life after school. Students in NSW are being supported to meet a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy to receive the HSC from 2020. To show they meet the HSC minimum standard, students need to achieve Level 3 or 4 in short online reading, writing and numeracy tests of skills for everyday life. Students in Year 10 and 11 have four opportunities a year to demonstrate the minimum standard (Level 3) and students in Year 12 have six opportunities this year.

Students in Years 10 and 11 will be undertaking these tests this term if they still need to demonstrate Level 3 in reading, writing and/or numeracy. Some students with a disability studying Life Skills courses may be exempt from meeting the minimum standard to receive their HSC credential. Please contact the school if you require more information on the HSC Minimum Standards or testing. More information can be found at:
