





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

When arriving for the Information Sessions we remind you to check in using the Services NSW QR Code, sanitise and maintain social distancing of at least 1.5m.

Parent Attendance at the LNPSSA Swimming Carnival

Due to current COVID-19 Protocols, attendance at the LNPSSA Swimming Carnival will be restricted to one adult per family.

Families will be issued with one (1) Event Pass which they will surrender at the Leeton Regional Aquatic Centre Entry Point. Please note that season ticket holders will also need to show their season pass, whilst non-season ticket holder will need to pay the Spectator Entry Fee of \$2 to enter the complex.

If parents are leaving the complex during the day and intend on returning, they will need to get a pass off the Kiosk Supervisor and re-present this pass when they return to the venue.

In line with COVID-19 protocols, once inside the Leeton Regional Aquatic Centre, spectators will be required to spectate in a designated area of the facility (to be advised) and **will not** be able to interact with any of the students during the day. Whilst this is a different way of supporting your children, we ask that this requirement is respected to enable such opportunities to continue at future events.

We thank everyone for their understanding as we navigate the COVID-19 Protocols in place whilst at the same time trying to provide as many opportunities for our kids and keep our community as engaged as possible.



Using Pre-payment System



Step 1: Students will create a Wish List of products they would like at school and bring it home either on Wednesday 17th February, or Thursday 18th February.

Step 2: Cross off the products that you don't wish to order, then add up the total cost on the front of the Wish List.

Step 3: You can send the **cash** & the Wish List back to school in an envelope with the child's name and class

OR

You can make a payment **online** (following the steps on the front page) then record the receipt number and details on the back of the paper.

When making an online payment please remember to send the wish list back to school, we are unable to fill orders without this.

Step 4: Return the Wish List and the cash or online payment details to school with the student.

Step 5: Students can return the wish lists to the box located in the School Library or to Mrs. Axtill.

Orders will then be returned to the students; if the product they have ordered is not available an order will be made, once orders arrive at school they will be given to students.

Please ensure that you are making orders for Book Fair products only and not items in the Bookclub pamphlets.

Visiting NSW Schools

Parents and carers are not allowed on school sites or at off-site school events held during school hours except for the following purposes only:

- Essential parent and carer meetings with teachers and/or school executives, with a scheduled appointment. This includes scheduled meetings with parents and carers of prospective students.
- Parents and carers who attend a school administration building or another defined location for the purpose of picking up their child if they are unwell or where they have been asked to arrange for a COVID-19 test after their child has displayed flu-like symptoms while at school.
- Parents and carers who need to be on-site for canteen and uniform shop duties or to collect or purchase uniforms.
- Parent or carer volunteers required as educational support roles for activities essential to the delivery of the curriculum such as reading groups, music, dance and kitchen garden areas. Schools are required to have scheduled programs in place and remind parents and carers that they must not attend school unless it has been previously arranged.
- Parents and carers can attend parent orientation meetings and 'meet the teacher' meetings with school staff for all year/stage groups. Meetings should be limited to 1 hour where possible. A COVID-19 Safety PlanExternal link must be in place. Physical distancing
- Physical distancing of students in schools is not required under the AHPPC guidelines.
- All teachers, support staff and parents must maintain physical distance from each other (1.5m).
- Parents should ensure school pick up and drop off arrangements enable them to physically distance from one another and from staff.

Re: Celebration of NSW Seniors Festival 2021

As you are aware NSW Seniors Festival will be observed in April in 2021. We would like to remind you that the Murrumbidgee Local Health District (MLHD) provides affordable physical activity options for seniors in your Council area. These physical activity classes are part of the Local Health District's focus on active ageing for falls prevention and enhancement of physical, social and emotional wellbeing of older adults.

Falls are the leading cause of injury for older people with one in three people aged over 65 years falling at least once a year. Evidence shows that regular physical activity, particularly balance and strength exercise, reduces falls risks. The MLHD attempts to reduce falls and keep older adults active by delivering:

- Evidence informed, low-cost physical activity classes for older people in the community. Over 100 trained volunteers lead aqua, gentle exercise and tai chi classes across all local government areas in the District.
- The Stepping On falls prevention program in over 20 community health facilities. This 7 week, evidence informed program, led by trained health professionals, is for those members of the community who are fearful of falling. This free programs consists of simple strength and balance exercises in addition to presentations from a range of local health providers.
- Healthy and Active Online A free online and telephone coaching program. Running over 10 weeks the individual works through online modules focusing on healthy lifestyle topics. Participants are supported by a trained coach to reach their healthy lifestyle goals

The Health Promotion team are willing to attend your Seniors Festival events in April 2021 and provide support. We can run demonstrations of our available classes, provide information on the programs available in your area or provide resources to you for distribution.
