This term we continued to build on the already extensive learning opportunities on offer here at Leeton High School. Our focus on the High Potential and Gifted Education policy has broadened our perspective on the many ways students can demonstrate their talent and potential. We are working hard to explore additional ways in which we can enrich our students to be their best and we are discovering many new resources to assist this development as well. This term, we are entering two teams into the DaVinci Decathlon competing against other school online in the following areas: English, Creative Producers, Science and Ideation, Engineering Challenge, Mathematics, Art and Poetry and Cartography, Code Breaking and Legacy. Best wishes to our Year 7 and 8 and Year 9 and 10 teams. The DaVinci Decathlon commences in April.

Mental Health Education Program

On Tuesday and Wednesday students will participate in the Mental Health Education Program supported by Headspace. This program delivers free mental health education workshops to school communities across Australia. The workshops have been developed to increase awareness, knowledge and skills in mental health literacy, accessing support and improving wellbeing for students. Workshops are interactive, strength-based and evidence-informed. Local primary schools will also be joining us on the Wednesday to participate in the workshops on offer.

Positive Behaviour for Learning

Students have been acknowledged 9.626 times for demonstrating positive behaviours so far this year. To celebrate, we will be holding an end of term MegaDraw. Next term our PBL weekly 30-minute lesson will focus on respectful and responsible behaviours through an anti-bullying and resilience program across Years 7-9. Students in Year 10 will commence an Academic Mentoring Program to best prepare them to undertake the transition into Year 11 in 2022. This program will support students in the subject selection process, to understand the requirements of courses, to explore ATAR and non ATAR study pathways, TAFE course options and more. This program will continue into Term 3. Year 11 and 12 will also explore a study-skills focus during their PBL lessons for Term 2.
