COVID Protocols Changes

The NSW Department of Education in consultation with the NSW Health released a range of COVID-19 Protocol changes on Friday that directly impact parents and carers and their engagement in school. These changes and how they will work at Parkview PS are outlined below.

- Parents and carers are able to enter school grounds but should continue to follow COVID-safe practices, including social distancing between adults of 1.5 metres. **This means that parents can enter the school as long as they scan in and out using the Services NSW QR Code located at each entry point. The flow on effect from this is socially distanced attendance at Friday Assemblies can recommence and events such as the Easter Hat Parade can now be attended (specific arrangements to maintain social distancing will be communicated prior to the event).**
- Parents and carers can attend school sporting events. School sporting events should align with requirements for community sporting competitions and training activities in NSW. **This means parents and carers can attend sporting events as long as they scan in and out using the Services NSW QR Code located at each entry point and maintain social distancing. For external events, please ensure you observe COVID-19 Protocols that are explicitly in place by the venue.**
- There are no recommended limits on singing groups in schools, including for in-class educational activities such as repetition, chanting, recitation, or singing activities. Five metres is recommended between a group of performing singers and other people, including the audience and conductor, where practicable. **This means all of our choir and band programs that include vocalists can resume as they did prior to March 2020.**
- Dancing activities – including dance classes, formals and social events – can proceed, but organisers should comply with any venue restrictions. **This means all of our choir and band programs that include vocalists can resume as they did prior to March 2020.**

These changes also mean that a number of our events that were still in doubt including Open Days and School Discos can commence being planned. We will keep the community informed of these events as they happen.

Parents are reminded that they need to scan in using the Services NSW QR Code outside the Library and also sign their children in at the table outside the Library.

LNPSSA Boys Soccer Championships

On Friday 5th March, the Parkview Boys soccer team competed in the Leeton/Narrandera gala day and the first rounds of the NSW PSSA Knockout.

In the first match against Narrandera, the Parkview team started strongly, Dean De Valentin scoring in the first three minutes. Salvatore Alampi followed up with some individual brilliance one minute later.

Strength in the midfield from Lucas Dowley, Johannes Ganderton, Deegan Tiffin, Cruze Dale and Salvatore Alampi ensured that Parkview built pressure in attack. Another three goals (Dean De Valentin, Cruze Dale and Salvatore Alampi) scored before half time.

Team work, effort and communication continued into the second half as Xavier Chilko scored in the first few minutes of the term. Defensive pressure from the backs, Jett Laycock, Xavier Sullivan, Jye De Paoli and Jaskirat Singh, continued to reap rewards for the team as co-captains Salvatore Alampi and Dean De Valentin scored twice more each.
