NAPLAN Practise Papers

Students in Years 3 & 5 will engage in NAPLAN practise experiences this week as we continue to prepare our children for engaging in NAPLAN Assessments which will be held in May. The purpose of the practise experience is to familiarise our children with the type of questions and interfaces they will experience. Our aim is to have the children familiar with this style of questioning so we can gain an accurate assessment of their understanding from these assessments.

Parents and carers are reminded that these assessments are a point in time assessment and one of many measures we use to track the understanding of our children in relation to the curriculum. We do not want the children to be stressed by engaging in these assessments, as they do not define them as a person, and are best used to provide feedback for teaching staff to track children and support our internal assessment linked to our where to next options for each individual child in literacy and numeracy.

If you have any questions or concerns please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher.

Despite the inclement conditions today, the LNPSSA Netball and Rugby League Championships went ahead, with Parkview students producing some excellent performances during the day.

In the **Netball** event, Parkview played Small Schools in the opening game and recorded a convincing 47-0 victory over a determined opponent. For Parkview Imogen Lang shot well at GS while Gracie Daly and Zoe Iannelli were dominant in the mid-court.

The second match of the day was the LNPSSA Final against Narrandera. 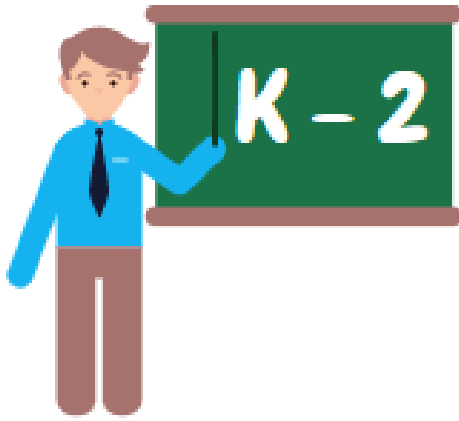
Our junior squash program provides both coaching and supervised games to help you learn.

BLUBBER ME!

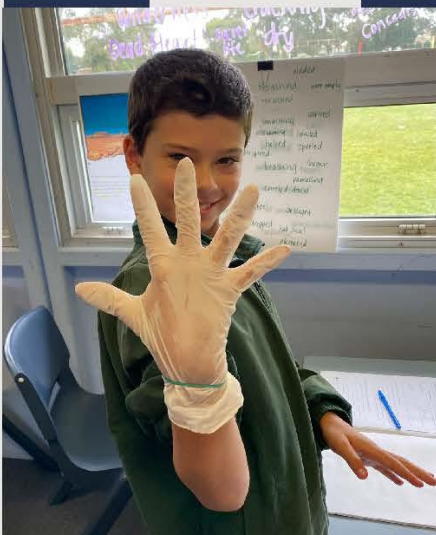

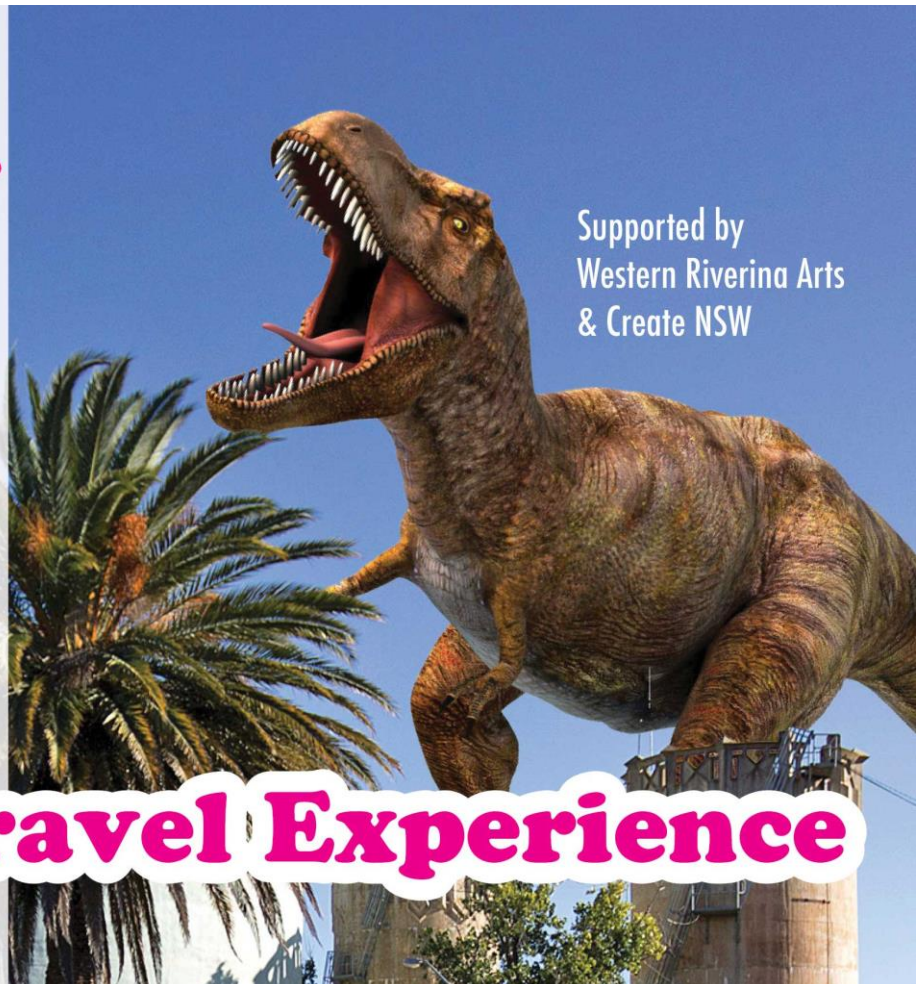

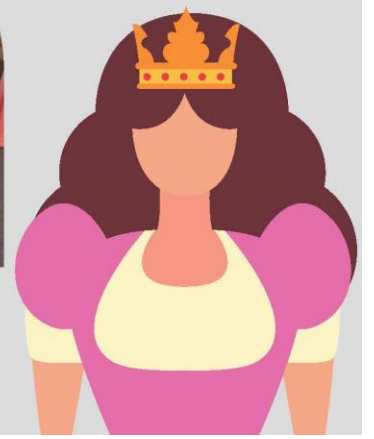
