NAIDOC Week Celebrations

NAIDOC Week is fast approaching with the annual celebration being hosted from July 4-11 this year with the theme of '**HEAL** COUNTRY!'.

This year's theme calls for all of us to continue to seek greater protections for lands, waters, sacred sites and cultural heritage of Aboriginals and Torres Strait Islanders in every aspect - spiritually, physically, emotionally, socially, and culturally.

NAIDOC 2021 invites the nation to embrace First Nations' cultural knowledge and understanding of Country as part of Australia's national heritage and equally respect the culture and values of Aboriginal peoples and Torres Strait Islanders as they do the cultures and values of all Australians.

On the second Thursday (July 8) of the School Holidays the Leeton Local Aboriginal Land Council will host its annual **NAIDOC Celebrations** in Gossamer Park from 11.00am-2.00pm. Our Wiradjuri Dance Group will perform at this event while a number of activities will be hosted during the day. It is a family friendly event and we encourage everyone to come along and enjoy a wonderful event.



On Friday, 16th July we will host our annual **K-6 NAIDOC Assembly** at school from 2.10pm. This will be linked to our regular weekly assembly with our students leading a recognition of NAIDOC Week.




