

Wellbeing and Health In-Reach Nurse (WHIN) Coordinator

A WHIN Coordinator has been appointed to service Parkview Public School, Leeton High School and Leeton Public School four days per week starting this week. Our WHIN Coordinator, Jodie Bloomfield, is a registered nurse who will be working across our school, with our learning and support team, to help connect students and families with health and community services.

She is here to help support students and families in addressing health needs, coordinate appropriate assessments and assist with referrals to any needed medical or social services. Jodie is employed by the Local Health District and is one of around 100 similar roles which are being introduced in schools across NSW in a partnership between NSW Health and the Department of Education. School Banking will continue every Tuesday! Why not involve your child in this wonderful financial literacy opportunity? Contact the school for more details on how to get your child involved.





Golden Apple Docket Fundraiser






