





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WEEK 1 TERM 3 Commencing Tuesday 13th July 2021

Welcome to what will be an exciting Term 3 at Parkview Public School. We trust that everyone in our community has enjoyed a wonderful winter holiday period with family and friends.

The start of the new term is shaped by the application of changes to COVID-19 Protocols in schools across NSW. The Department of Education, based on advice from NSW Health, has devised guidelines for schools based on the known challenges of COVID-19. The current restrictions linked to our school are outlined below.

Notes that you can expect to see this week:

- Book Fair Information
- Stage 2 and 3 Major Excursion details

Notes in the last week:

- Semester 1 Reports (all students)
- Term 3 PLP Conference Booking Forms (all students)

COVID-19 Protocols

All students are expected to be at school unless they have even the mildest of COVID-19 symptoms.

Under the current health orders, there is nothing to restrict students and staff who must attend school from moving between two areas with different levels of restrictions. Students and staff should reduce traveling to geographical areas with higher levels of COVID-19 restrictions in place.

A reminder for all families

Students should not attend school if unwell, even with mild symptoms of COVID-19. Any person with any COVID-19 symptoms should be sent home and should not return until they have received a negative test result and are symptom-free. In circumstances where children have other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms a letter from their GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test.

Anyone who is unwell with COVID-19 symptoms is strongly encouraged to get tested and self-isolate until a negative result is received.

Masks and face coverings

While at school, masks or face coverings are recommended in all indoor settings for:

- all students in Year 7 and above
- all staff in school settings

Masks are mandatory on public transport. This applies to students aged 13 years and over, and staff when travelling to and from school and during school excursions by public transport or by chartered or private transport services.

Visitors

Non-essential visitors are not permitted in schools. Some visitors are permitted in schools based on the guidelines that follow

Parents and carers must follow their school's advice regarding changes to drop off and pick up including staying in the car when dropping off and picking up children if safe to do so.

Parents should:

- maintain physical distancing by avoiding gathering outside of school gates
- remain outside of school grounds (note some exceptions may apply regarding schools for specific purposes, vulnerable students or students with disability)
- follow mask-wearing requirements and sign in using the Service NSW QR code when entering the school

QR code sign-in process for all staff and visitors

The NSW Government have introduced mandatory QR codes across a range of additional settings, including schools. Parents and carers permitted on school sites for specific purposes are required to check in using the QR codes available and check out once they leave the school site.

What is permitted during school hours and within schools under these restrictions

Schools can operate:

- SRE/SEE (Scripture)
- Sport within school grounds may continue, provided mingling of students in minimised
- Work experience
- Emergency drills.

Community activities

- Childhood Education Services (OSHC, vacation care, preschools etc.)
- Community Language Schools
- Playgroups
- Share Our Space will proceed in-line with current health advice. All visitors will be required to practice physical distancing and check in using the Service NSW QR code
- School holiday programs
- All external providers and specialist programs not directly related to educational outcomes and support
- GAs can conduct critical or urgent works on site.

Visitors

- Allied Health partners and non-school staff that are unable to deliver critical services remotely
- Workers supporting the infrastructure development and maintenance of schools can continue on site. This includes contractors and maintenance providers.

What is permitted with modification

School based activities

- Assemblies can be held with COVID-safe practices in place. No visitors permitted
- Singing, chanting, group repetition and choirs are permitted if conducted outside in a well-ventilated area
- Bands and ensembles are permitted in line with current health advice
- Dance or drama are permitted in line with COVID-Safe practices within classes. · Library activities are permitted in line with the Infection Control requirements
- Principal-endorsed activities for students

Events

- Community use and events outside school hours
- Excursions will be limited to outdoor locations within the Local Government Area of the school where the school can demonstrate COVID Safe practices
- Parents and carers may attend for the purposes of school orientation programs
- School orientation programs are permitted with COVID-safe practices in place
- Inter-school, inter-regional and intrastate activities and events, such as gala days and sporting carnivals can continue with COVID-safe practices in place
- Schools must make alternative arrangements for performances, productions, concerts, speech nights, award presentations, graduations, formals and school dances that support the broader guidance. Personal hygiene, physical distancing, cleaning and record keeping practices must be adhered to at these events

Community activities

- P&C activities including meetings
- Community use outside school hours
- Canteens and uniform stores where appropriate hygiene measures are in place
- Electoral commission officers conducting polling location inspections permitted they follow COVID-19 requirements for visitors
- All polling days will require additional planning from the electoral commission based on health advice of the time.

Activities that are not permitted or on hold during school hours or within school grounds

Schools must cease the following activities:

School based activities

- Camps and out of area field trips
- Voluntary student activities of a religious nature (VSA)
- Overnight stays
- International excursions
- Student visits to aged care facilities
- Community events within school hours

Visitors

- Official visitors and dignitaries
- Media and production crews

Term 3 PLP Conferences

Term 3 PLP Conferences will be hosted next week (Week 2, Term 3). Parents were invited to these meetings when reports were distributed at the conclusion of Term 2. If you are yet to secure a time for a PLP Interview with your child's teacher, we encourage you to return your interview request slip as soon as possible.

More details regarding the structure of these interview, taking into account COVID-19 Protocols will be distributed to families in the coming days.

Wakakirri and KROP Dance Postponed

Due to the recent change in protocols for schools linked to the COVID-19 Pandemic, our participation in the dance events of Wakakirri in Canberra and KROP in Griffith has been **postponed**.

We are still optimistic that both of these events will proceed later in the year should the current outbreak be controlled, however more information will be made available for participants as it becomes known.

Our children will continue to rehearse for upcoming events in the Leeton Eisteddfod and Parkview In Lights in line with appropriate COVID Protocols.

Term 3 Book Fair

The excitement of our **Term 3 Scholastic Book Fair** reaches Parkview PS next week! Due to COVID Restrictions preventing non-essential people on site, this Book Fair will again follow the successful model used in 2020, where children visit the Fair, create wish lists and allow parents to either pay by credit card or cash. Details linked to this process are included in a separate flyer which has been distributed to all children today.







Parkview PS competed in the Riverina Quarter Finals of the NSW PSSA Knockout in the last week of Term 3. Both the boys and girls team travelled to Finley for their matches against Finley PS.

After a brief warm up, the girls were on the quite damp and boggy field. It was a fairly evenly matched first half with strong defence from Gracie Daly and Miya Hoffman. Finley also had a strong backline, and a couple of handy forwards constantly putting Parkview under pressure. But through strong team work and great goalie work from Makayla Heath, no goals were scored by either team in the first half.

The second half started much the same as the first, possession going to and fro. But after five minutes, Finley's forward pressure found an open goal and led 1-nil. Shortly, thereafter, Finley followed up for their second. But the Parkview girls did not give up. Lucy Gilmour displayed consistent high effort while Mikayla Cawdell-Smith also showed great skill through the midfield. Finley closed the game with another late goal to win 3-0.

Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- · category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. To find out more about these matters, please refer to the <u>Australian Government's Privacy Policy</u> (https://www.education.gov.au/privacy-policy).
