





# **COVID 19 Protocol Reminders**

Thank you to everyone who has assisted us to implement the revised protocols for schools related to the COVID-19 Pandemic. All elements of these protocols are based exclusively on advice from NSW Health. In particular we wish to remind our community of the following requirements:

# e Visitors

Non-essential visitors are not permitted in schools. Some visitors are permitted in schools based on the guidelines that follow.

Parents should:

- maintain physical distancing by avoiding gathering outside of school gates
- remain outside of school grounds (note some exceptions may apply regarding schools for specific purposes, vulnerable students or students with disability)-please discuss this with the school if you think it applies to you
- follow mask-wearing requirements and sign in using the Service NSW QR code when entering the school

# QR code sign-in process for all staff and visitors

The NSW Government have introduced mandatory QR codes across a range of additional settings, including schools. Staff and on-site visitors, including contractors, are required to check in every day

What is permitted during school hours and within schools under these restrictions:

# Community activities

The following activities can continue on school sites:

- childhood education services (OSHC, vacation care, preschools etc.)
- playgroups
- all external providers and specialist programs not directly related to educational outcomes and support



The following visitors are permitted on school sites:

• allied health partners and non-school staff that are unable to deliver critical services remotely

# What is permitted with modification (School-based activities)

- Assemblies can be held with COVID-Safe practices in place. No visitors permitted
- Singing, chanting, group repetition and choirs are permitted if conducted outside in a well-ventilated area
- Bands and ensembles are permitted in line with Health advice on maximum indoor and outdoor gatherings
- Dance or drama are permitted in line with COVID-safe practices within classes
- Library activities are permitted in line with the Infection Control requirements
- Principal-endorsed activities for students are permitted in line with COVID-safe practices

# What is permitted with modification (Events)

- Parents and carers may attend for the purposes of school orientation programs
- School orientation programs are permitted with COVID-safe practices in place
- Inter-school sport and physical activity, including the Representative School Sport pathway (team and individual), can occur across Local Government Areas (apart from those in Greater Sydney) with COVID-safe practices in place. This includes gala days, trials, knock outs and carnivals
- Schools must make alternative arrangements for performances, productions, concerts, speech nights, award presentations, graduations, formals and school dances that support the broader guidance. Personal hygiene, physical distancing, cleaning and record-keeping practices must be adhered to at these events

### Community activities


The following activities may continue in line with COVID-safe practices:

- P&C activities, including meetings
- community use outside school hours
- canteens and uniform stores where appropriate hygiene measures are in place

Activities that are not permitted or on hold during school hours or within school grounds (School based activities)
Schools must cease the following activities:

- camps and out of area field trips
- overnight stays

- international excursions
- student visits to aged care facilities
- community events within school hours



While at school, masks or face coverings are recommended in all indoor settings for:

- all students in Year 7 and above
- · all staff in school settings.

Masks are mandatory on public transport. This applies to students aged 13 years and over, and staff when travelling to and from school and during school excursions by public transport or by chartered or private transport services.



5T have been doing lots of work connected to the Olympic Games this term, linking in Mathematics, English and Creative Arts. We even held our own Mini Olympics.


In Mathematics, we have been using scoring to measure, record and order decimal numbers. We even had the challenge of adding decimal numbers in the javelin event of our Mini Olympics.

In English, we listened to a Podcast about the history of the Olympics to learn some interesting facts, researched Olympic events and enjoyed watching a range of events to use as writing stimuli. One of our Literacy Tasks was to use pictograms to determine what events feature in the Olympics Games and then research the event to find out what it is all about.

In visual arts we used drawing and sculpture to create Olympic themed shadow art. First we had to draw the pictogram (the shadow) and then use foil to create a sculpture of the athlete. For our Assembly item we acted out still frames of the Olympic pictograms and also played a fun drama game called "What are you Doing?" where we had to act out various sports. For this activity we had to project our voices and speak loudly so that both the audience our parents on the Zoom at home could hear us.

In Week 3, all of year 5 got together to hold our own Mini Olympics. We participated in teams of 8 in 5 different events. First, teams had to work together to create uniforms, a mascot and a flag and then we opened up the event with an opening ceremony and torch relay. The first event held was a skipping challenge, which included both an individual and team component. Next up was Captain Ball and River Bank Bridge. Teams then participated in the javelin event where we each had to have our own throw and then add up our teams distances to determine our final score for that event. The last event for the day was Lava Floor Rescue. This activity required teamwork and strength as two members of each team had to rescue the remainder of their teammates from the opposite side of the basketball court using only two gym mats and without touching the floor.
