We are looking forward to another awesome year of Bright Beginnings in 2022!

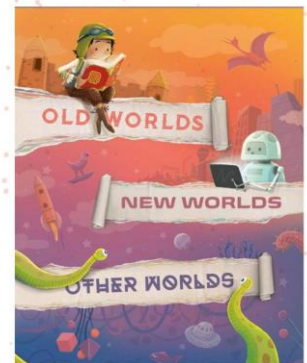
