Last week was also notable for the hosting of a the very popular **K-2 Major Excursion** the Griffith Regional Theatre to watch the stage show 'Guess How Much I Love You'. The children displayed outstanding behaviour throughout and had a wonderful time at the event and enjoyed their time at City Park following the show. Thanks is extended to all the parents who supported their children to attend this experience.

The new week at Parkview is set to be enormous as we celebrate National Reconciliation Week (NRW). National Reconciliation Week is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

The dates for NRW are the same each year; **27 May to 3 June.** These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey— the successful <u>1967 referendum</u>, and the <u>High Court Mabo decision</u> respectively.



**27 May 1967** is notable for Australia's most successful **referendum** which saw more than 90 per cent of Australians vote to give the Australian Government power to make laws for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and recognise them in the Census.

**3 June 1992** is notable for the Australian High Court delivering the Mabo decision, the culmination of Eddie Koiki Mabo's challenge to the legal terminology of 'terra nullius' (land belonging to no one) and leading to the legal recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as the Traditional Owners and Custodians of lands. This decision paved the way for Native Title.

As always, we will recognise and celebrate Reconciliation Week at Parkview, with more details on our events shared later in the newsletter.

This week will also be significant for two events major events for our students. Two Year 6 students, **Josephine Irvin** and **Xavier Chilko** will travel to Tamworth to represent Riverina PSSA at the **NSWPSSA State Basketball Championships** while on Friday evening our **Senior Dance Ensemble** consisting of **Lucy Gilmour, Zarly Pike, Montana Nardi, Grace Curry, Talia Mulloy, Zoe White, Miah Weymouth, Grace Goman, Zarah Reid** and **Sadie Tiffin** will perform at Riverina Dance Festival at the Griffith Regional Theatre. 





## Parenting Children with ADHC

The Parenting Children with ADHD program has been designed to give parents and carers an understanding of what ADHD is, its nature and how it impacts on the child and his/her family. Throughout the course we will address the following;.

### THE GOAL OF THIS COURSE...

Is to inform and empower parents/carers to work together with their child to cope with the challenges of ADHD by passing on practical, workable strategies that will make a difference in the lives of all family members.

- Neurodevelopmental understanding of ADHD (Brain Development)
- Executive Functions and how they are implicated in ADHD and the impact on learning
