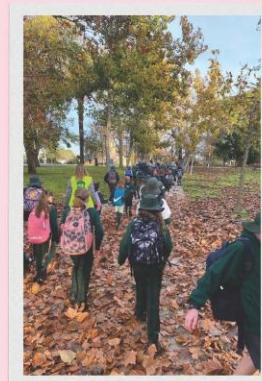

### **Premiers Debating Challenge Update**

Last Thursday our two debating teams ventured a hop, skip and a jump away to take on the Leeton PS debaters in the first round of the Premier's Debating Challenge.

Our PPS Cats were up first, consisting of speakers **Jack Crowe, Ava Gilmour, Zoe White** and team manager **Airlie Chilko**. It was a unanimous topic selection of "All primary schools should ban homework for students", in which Parkview won the toss and chose to be the affirmative team.



The team received an hour to prepare which they are not allowed to receive any assistance from their teacher. For their first debate, the team went incredibly well, and presented some extremely valid points for why homework should be banned for students. With reasons such as, 'it influences mental health' and 'limiting sporting/lifestyle commitments outside of school'. They received very valuable feedback from the adjudicator, going down narrowly to the LPS Talkers. They will apply this feedback to their next round of debates.

Next up to present their debate were the PPS Giants, consisting of speakers **Grace Curry, Taylia Coughlan, Sadie Tiffin**, and team manager **Maycie Wall**. The choosing of this topic was not as simple as the first debate. Selecting completely different topics, we had to flip a coin between two topics.

With Parkview calling heads and winning, their selected topic was "All students should receive two chances on every test or assignment", in which they also argued the affirmative. This team also went incredibly well and argued some very valuable points. For example, 'some children get stressed out during tests and don't produce their best work. Hence, if they could receive another chance, they may achieve better results and feel more comfortable'. Again, they received some great comments from the adjudicator, but narrowly fell to the LPS Thinkers.

This was a great experience for our Parkview students, with many of them participating in their very first debate. We are looking forward to seeing their growth throughout the challenge with many more opportunities to harness their skills.

Parkview will host Griffith East PS in the next round of debating on Thursday.

### **Sentral Parent Portal**

The Sentral Parent Portal is proving popular with registered parents and carers, with a range of information, push notifications, permission notes and PLP Conference bookings all currently available at your fingertips through your smart device.

If you are yet to register your account, we encourage you to do so as soon as possible. Below are some reminders on how to connect and what the purpose of the new portal is:

How do you connect to Sentral Parent Portal?

1. Download the Sentral Parent Portal app through the Apple Store or Google Play. This is the most convenient way to access so that you can turn notifications on through the app. You can also access the portal online through the website <https://parkviewps.sentral.com.au/portal2/#!/login>
2. Create your account in Sentral Parent Portal. You then have to wait for school approval. This approval is usually completed once a day, at the end of the day. When your account has been approved, you will receive a confirmation email.
3. Once approved, you will then need to use the unique access key to connect with your student/s information. This key was provided to families at the end of Term 1. Should you need this information provided again, please contact the school. Once you enter the key, you can then access a whole range of information, and this is also the place to book in your interview time.



Sentral Parent Portal will also allow you to keep up to date with news and information, update your child's attendance details and in the near future also respond to permissions notes. It really will be a very handy tool for all parents.

Last term all parents and carers received their own unique access key (unique for each parent/ carer of children) that will enable them to register with the school for communication specific to your children. We encourage everyone to download the Sentral Parent Portal App and follow the information on the letter to start your new communication experience with the school.

Once fully operational, the portal will enable parents and carers to book PLP Conferences, access newsletters, school reports, lodge absence notifications, check student attendance levels, grant permissions for excursions and make payments among other exciting features. Not all of these elements are available yet as we roll out different aspects of the portal, but they will become a feature over the next couple of months. If you have any questions, please contact the school.

### **Winhangara Playgroup**

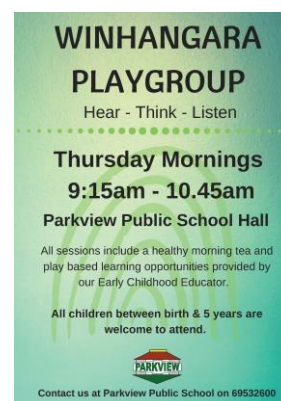

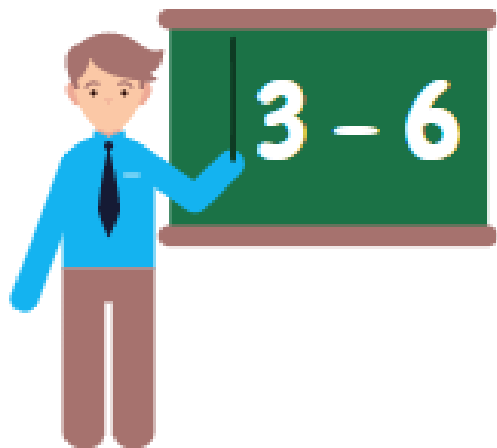
