WEEK 7 TERM 3 Commencing Monday 28th August 2023

Welcome to Week 7 of a rapidly evaporating term at Parkview Public School. The last seven days have been incredibly dynamic in our community with incredible achievements by our students in scholastic endeavours, in the performing arts and on the sporting fields.

We start this week by celebrating the efforts of our **19 Tournament of Minds** participants who travelled to Wagga Wagga yesterday to participate in the Riverina Finals of the event. The students assembled at Sturt Public School to deliver their presentations that they have been working through for many months. They also engaged in an impromptu response section of the event.

This week we also acknowledge the efforts of Years 5 and 6 students who continue to be actively engaged in the **Murrumbidgee Academy of STEM Excellence Virtual STEM Academy**, with a number of students recently successfully completing explicit areas of study.

Jed Crowe, Maycie Wall, Sadie Tiffin and Aiden Fazekas all successfully completed the **Indigenous Seasons Skill Builder program**, which provided students with an introduction to Aboriginal Seasonal Calendars. Students learnt the differences between the seasons in different parts of Australia. Students examined the weather and what traditional seasonal foods are available to different Aboriginal communities during the year. Students were challenged to create their own seasonal calendar for their community, thinking of changes in weather and lifestyle during the year in their local community.



Zara Munro and Taylia Coughlan all successfully completed the **Scientific Inquiry Skill Builder program**, which allowed the students to solve open-ended scientific inquiry problems. Students developed a range of thinking strategies (critical thinking, problem solving, curiosity, creativity, collaboration and communication) that enabled them to approach challenges and problems from different perspectives.



Jake Lashbrook, Keira Hewson, Miah Weymouth and Grace Curry have all successfully completed the **Arduino Microcontroller Skill Builder program**, which empowered our students to learn about the purpose of micro-controllers and how electronic circuits can be created in order to interact with users and the environment. Students learnt to program an Arduino UNO micro-controller using C++ language. Students also learnt to create electronic circuits that were controlled by the Arduino UNO.

Well done to all students on their successful immersion in these valuable learning experiences.

We congratulate the children on their diligent engagement in these STEM opportunities and look forward to further experiences later in the year.

It was also an enormous week for our students on the sporting fields with significant representation at the **Riverina Athletics Championships** on Friday as well as our participation in **the Riverina Girls and Boys Soccer Quarter Finals** in Deniliquin on Wednesday. A full wrap of both events is contained in Talking Sport however it is worthy of celebrating three new Riverina Champions in our school after **Tristan Ganderton, Hunter Heath and Blake Heath** all won events on Friday!

It was another busy week at the **Leeton Eisteddfod** for our students with our Junior and Senior Choirs in action in their respective Choral Sections during the week. Both of our choirs performed with distinction with our Junior Choir placing second in the K-2 Choral Section, whilst our 3-6 Choir also performed with distinction earning a High Commendation for their performance. It was terrific to see so many parents and carers at the event supporting our kids.

Perhaps the highlight of the week was the annual hosting of the **Book Week Character Parade** at school last Tuesday. It was amazing to see so many people in our community celebrating a love of literature, and weren't there some outstanding costumes to enjoy!

TOURNAMENT OF MINDS

On Sunday 27th August, 19 Parkview students went to represent Parkview Public School at the Tournament of Minds in Wagga.

Parkview entered three teams in this years Tournament of Minds and had some great competition from many schools around the area. This is the most amount of teams entered and students interested for many

years!



Our first team to present were the 'Parkview Painters' a team comprised of Talia Mulloy, Grace Curry, Zoe White, Zara Munro, Ava Weymouth, Pippa Quigley and Savannah Auddino. This team participated in the 'Arts' Challenge. They had to create an Immersive Art Experience based on a chosen artist. They chose the artist Banksy and explored the artwork Umbrella Girl. This group received great feedback about their understanding of the artwork and their transition between scenes.

Our second team to compete were the 'Parkview Historians' a team comprised of Jake Lashbrook, Keon Caneno, Tayliah Coughlan, Sadie Tiffin and Jasper White. This team participated in the 'Social Sciences' challenge. Their challenge was to identify two historical events, explain how they are connected and use an artefact to show the connection between these events. This team explored the Bubonic Plague and Covid19, even using sock puppets to help engage the audience. This team received great feedback on the use of their puppets and the props that they have created - including a time machine.



The last team to present in the Long-Term challenge were the 'Parkview Sparks' a team made up of Link Williams-O'Leary, Beau Williams, Tristan Ganderton, Zac Iannelli, Maycie Wall, Evangeline Boots and Phoebe Crispe. This group participated in the 'Language Literature' Challenge. They had to persuade the Tribunal of Monuments committee to select their chosen character to create a monument in their chosen city. This group explored the story 'Fantastic Mr Fox' and decided to create a monument in New York City. They received positive feedback about their props and their idea to select Wall Street in their chosen city.



At the end of each Long-Term Challenge, the teams had to participate in a spontaneous challenge. This involving the students being presented with a problem and then having to work together to come to an answer.

We are all extremely proud of these students for the work they have done leading up to the event and how they presented themselves and Parkview on Sunday. Thank you to the parents/carers who were able to transport their children to Wagga and be able to watch their children.

That forward pressure allowed Ava Weymouth to sneak a goal past the keeper in the 8th minute of the game.

It was a tight contest for the first few minutes in the match with possession moving from one end to the other. However, Finley scored first when their attacking line were left with too much time. Shortly after, some skilled passing and committed effort resulted in Finley jumping ahead 2-0.

Despite this, the Parkview boys were not giving in. Zac Iannelli, Jack Crowe and Deklan Boots continued to display tireless work and helped to surge the ball forward to Brock Marks and Deegan Tiffin. A handball in the box by Finley allowed captain Jack Crowe to take a penalty and he secured the point on the scoreboard with a kick to the lower right corner of the net. Parkview went into the half-time break 2-1 down.

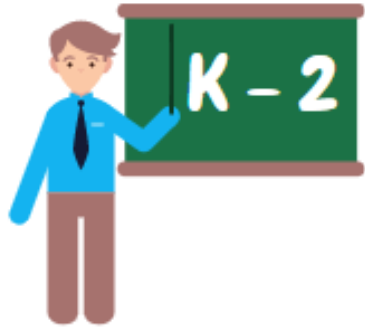

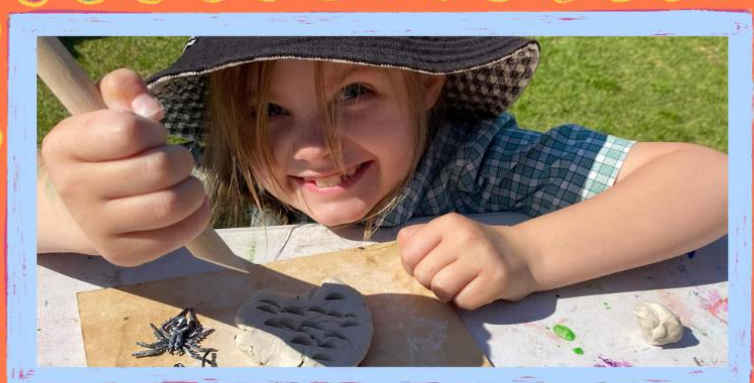
