

Welcome to the final week of what has been an extremely exciting and rewarding term at Parkview

Public School! As we reach the end of the term it is timely to reflect upon the myriad of achievements from our children throughout the last ten learning weeks. Below is an overview of the many elements we have to be proud of from the last ten weeks of learning:

- 34 Years 4-6 students performing at the Canberra Theatre as part of **Wakakirri 2023**, earning multiple accolades for their achievements
- 25 Years 2-4 students performing at the Griffith Regional Theatre as a part of KROP 2023.
- Various dance and choral groups performing at the **Leeton Eisteddfod** with our Years 2-4 Dance Ensemble placing first and our K-2 Choir placing  $2^{nd}$  and our Senior Dance Ensemble placing  $3^{rd}$  in their respective divisions
