

Check-in Assessment for Year 6

During Weeks 9 & 10 of this term, Year 6 students will participate in the Check-in assessment. The Check-in assessment is an NSW Department of Education online literacy and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor student learning.

The assessment will supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs. Students who already receive additional support in the classroom will receive the same level of support during the assessment. The major details of the assessment are outlined below:

- · The assessment will be scheduled for our Year 6 students during Weeks 9-10
- · All students will complete a reading assessment, a writing assessment, and a numeracy assessment

Riverina Girls Soccer Semi Final

The Parkview Girls Soccer Team travelled to Griffith last Tuesday to play against Griffith East Public School in the Riverina Semi Final.

The girls were nervous but prepared to face a tough opposition and, with a few structural changes from their previous game, started off strong. Phoebe Crispe and Sapphire Ward helped to drive the ball forward into our attacking half creating pressure on the GEPS defence early. The girls linked well up the left sideline, feeding the ball to Ava Weymouth who created some early scoring opportunities. Evie Boots and Amethyst Ward held strong in the centre to feed the ball forward. Late into the first half GEPS we're able to break through our defensive line and capitalised on a defensive error to take the lead 0-1 into half time.

Determined not to be shaken, Parkview continued to apply pressure on the GEPS defence allowing Ava Weymouth the opportunity to pop the ball over the keepers' head to level the scores.

Airlie Chilko and Zeanna Johnstone worked well to shut down any attacking drive from the opposition, with Miah Weymouth making solid clearances from the backline.

The scores were still level at the end of regular time, sending the game into extra time with 5 minutes each way. GEPS applied the pressure early making a couple of runs into attack. However, Keira Hewson was able to shut down their major goal attempt and safely clear it out of defence.

The Parkview girls showed an incredible amount of determination, with Emerald Ward and Piper De Valentin shutting down any further attack from the opposition, allowing Ava Gilmour to have a few more attempts at goal.

At the end of extra time, the scores were still at 1-1, however Parkview lead in the count on corners 3-1, so the victory was awarded to Parkview.
