This Thursday we will celebrate NAIDOC in our community with all our students engaging in cultural immersion activities as we host Michael Lyons and the Sandhills Artefacts team.

National NAIDOC Week celebrations are held across Australia in the **first week of July (7th – 14th)** each year (Sunday to Sunday), to celebrate and recognise the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. NAIDOC Week is an opportunity for all Australians to learn about First Nations cultures and histories and participate in celebrations of the oldest, continuous living cultures on earth. You can support and get to know your local Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander communities through activities and events held across the country.

This year's theme celebrates the unyielding spirit of our communities and invites all to stand in solidarity, amplifying the voices that have long been silenced.

The fire represents the enduring strength and vitality of Indigenous cultures, passed down through generations despite the challenges faced. It is a symbol of connection to the land, to each other, and to the

rich tapestry of traditions that define Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. As we honour this flame, we kindle the sparks of pride and unity, igniting a renewed commitment to acknowledging,

preserving, and sharing the cultural heritage that enriches our nation.

"Blak, Loud and Proud" encapsulates the unapologetic celebration Indigenous identity, of empowering us to stand tall in our heritage and assert our place in the modern world. This theme calls for a reclamation of narratives, an amplification of voices. and an



unwavering commitment to justice and equality. It invites all Australians to listen, learn, and engage in meaningful dialogue, fostering a society where the wisdom and contributions of Indigenous peoples are fully valued and respected.

White Cross Mobile Dental Care

The visit from the **White Cross Mobile Dental Care** continues this week. The visit enables parents and carers to access a Preventative Dental Program which provides students with a comprehensive examination of all teeth and gums, scale/clean and polish, fluoride application fissure sealants with **no out of pocket expenses**.

At the completion of the examination all parents and carers will receive an assessment letter outlining the dental treatment provided to children and any additional invasive dental treatment that may be required to be followed up by your preferred local dentist.
