Ms Hickson is a substantive full-time teacher at Parkview, who is currently working as an Aboriginal Education Strategic Delivery Officer as part of the Teacher Quality and Impact Directorate.

Ms Hickson worked in collaboration with her cousin Mr Richard Gilbert to develop this artwork which has 'Working together to make a difference' at the heart of its meaning.

The image in the artwork, which is incorporated into the shirts, represents Ms Hickson's first year teaching and making positive connections and collaborating with the Aboriginal Education Team to be able to make a real difference for students who look up to her as a role model/mentor. Not just for Indigenous students, but all students!

Each big circle represents connection with teachers and SLSOs and the little white dot represents all stages in education including pre-school and the dot patterns around them representing students. We are grateful that Ms Hickson allowed us to share her artwork, with such a deep personal meaning, to be the basis of our Year 6 Shirts this year.

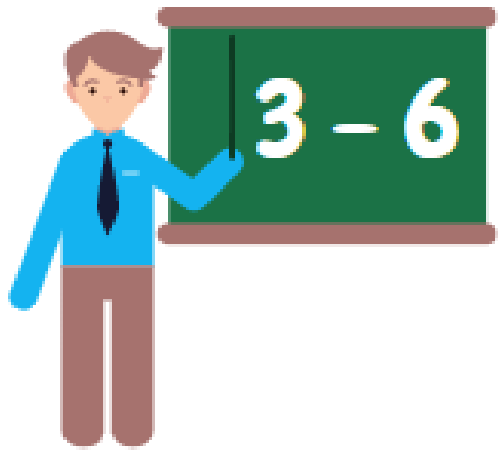
