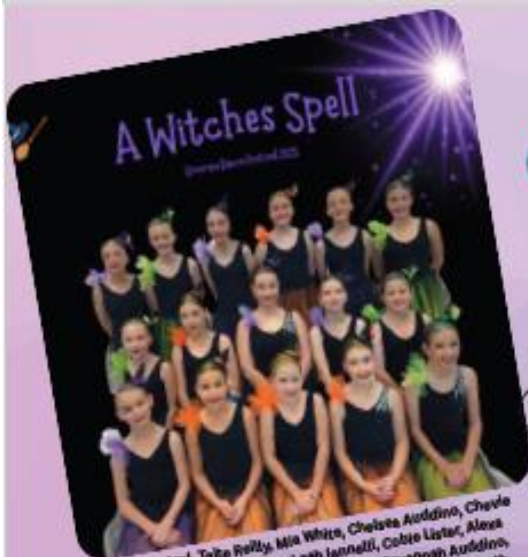
Golden Apple Docket Fundraiser

Lots of sweaty brains working collaboratively to solve problems.

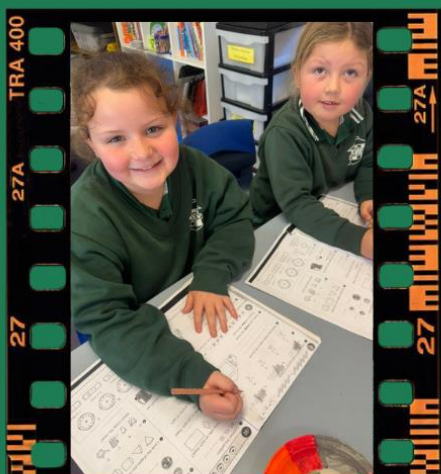

They were then asked to imagine themselves as one of astronauts and write diary entries describing their experiences - from launching into space to landing on the moon and beyond.

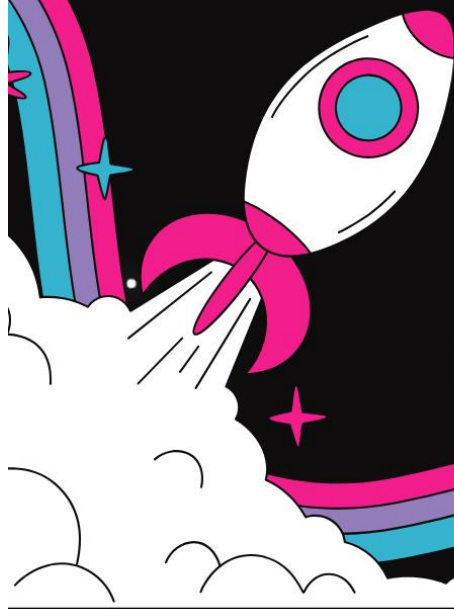
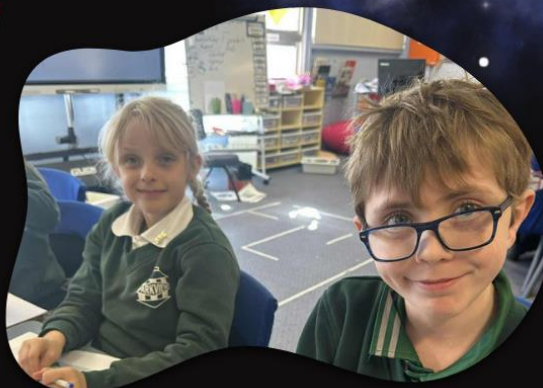

Year Three took a deep dive into local bird habitat with Red Earth Ecology and learned how the shape of beaks play a role in diet.

The kids watched videos of cockatoos using a bubbler and opening wheelie bins, then handled cuttings from blooming acacias, mistletoe and eucalyptus. After a brief interlude shaking tail feathers, the class identified parrots from the region and coloured in activity sheets.

The kids have come away with some good tools and understanding to help them match the right kind of plants for the birds they want to see in our backyards and streets.

Next week they'll extend today's observations into the field with an excursion to Fivebough Wetlands to learn about the beaks and habitat of water birds.

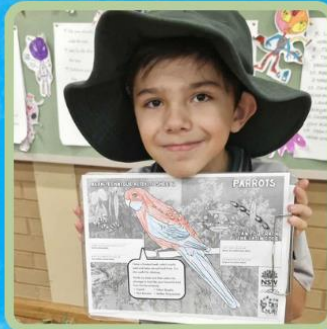

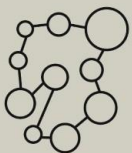
